TRAINING DIRECTORS NEWS

WINTER SAFETY TIPS: Construction doesn't stop just because the weather turns cold. Safety becomes more important during the winter months, which means that there are a few extra precautions we can take to overcome the cold. Dress in layers with the outer layer being rather loose and the inner layers being tighter and use the outer layer of clothing as a wind breaker which makes the inner layer more effective in keeping you warm. Avoid getting your clothing wet as wet clothing will not serve as a protection from the cold. Protect your feet!! Use wool socks for better warmth. Keep your head warm and protected, most of the heat loss comes from the head. Safety in the winter months is all about using the right clothing to overcome the dangers that the cold create. Take the extra precautions to help in keeping you safe and avoid mishaps and injuries.
